miner at Wirksworth, who, on Tuesday, met his death in a most painful
accident.

John Robert Dagley (25), of
Wirksworth, was driving a
six-wheeled tractor, which was
being used for the purpose of
clearing the path of the Derby
road, when it struck a tree trunk,
and the tractor, which was
loaded with a large quantity of
manure, overturned, and the
man was killed.
